Academic Honesty

- x Using direct quotations or sections or paraphrased material in a lab report without appropriate acknowledgemeend/or citation
- x Faking a report or fabricating data

Essays and Assignments

- x Submitting an essay written in whole or in part by someone else as one's own
- x Prepaing an essay or assignment for submission by another student
- x Copying an essay or assignment, or allowing one's essay or assignment to be copied by someone else
- x Using direct quotations or sections of paraphrased material without appropriate acknowledgement
- x The buying or selling of term papers or assignments
- x Submitting the same piece of work in more than one course without the permission of the faculty
- x Submitting all or part of a computer program without major modifications of one's own

In addition, other examples not listed above but in conflict with the spirit of academic honesty at Niagara College will also be subject to penalty.
